

**IEEE plaque honoring Ben Franklin**

Before a standing-room-only crowd of engineers, friends, a few Newton's Landing neighbors and the ghosts of Ben Franklin and his intellectual companions in his Junto discussion group, ECP Board member, Peter Silverberg lifted a red cloth Friday evening, August 7th, 2009, to unveil a bronze plaque that will forever hang in the Library of the American Philosophical Society (APS) commemorating Franklin's pioneering research on electricity.

The brass plaque, which will hang in the APS Library at 105 S. Fifth Street, just a block from Independence Hall, commemorates the publication of Franklin's Book, "Experiments and Observations on Electricity," in 1751.


