#### **HALL OF FAME GUIDELINES**

- This recognition is bestowed upon an individual, a team of individuals, an engineering project or a company whose engineering achievements have had a long-lasting impact on engineering and/or the public.
- The individual, team, engineering project or company must be (or have been) in the Delaware Valley<sup>1</sup>. The achievements should be primarily within the Delaware Valley. However, achievements outside of the Delaware Valley can be considered.
- 3. The goal of the recognition is to cover a broad range of time (from the beginnings of the Delaware Valley) and a broad range of disciplines.
- 4. Multiple awards can be made each year, with a limit of five in any given year.

The Delaware Valley has been the home to many outstanding engineers, engineering projects, and engineering accomplishments. The Delaware Valley Engineering Hall of Fame was established to bestow recognition upon those who have had a long-lasting impact on engineering and/or the public.

The initial induction was held in 2005; help us to continue to add to this list of outstanding engineering honorees by submitting a nomination.

- 5. Selection will be made by the DVEW Advisory Committee (comprised of former Engineers of the Year).
- 6. No recognition will be given within ten years of the completion of the achievement being recognized.

- **ENIAC**, the first electronic digital computer (2005)
- Discovery of Electricity, by Benjamin Franklin (2005)
- Fairmount Waterworks, the country's first advanced municipal water system and initial portion of Fairmount Park (2005)
- Pennsylvania Railroad, at one time the "Standard Railroad of the World" and one of the largest (2005)
- Removal of the "Chinese Wall", elevated rail between 30th Street and Suburban Stations (2005)
- RCA Victor, development of Victrola Recordings (2005)
- Benjamin Franklin Bridge, permitting efficient travel across the Delaware River (2005)
- **Schuylkill Expressway**, the first limited access roadway in the area, predating the interstate highway system (2005)
- Center City [Phila] Commuter Tunnel, connecting Suburban Station and Reading Terminal (2005)
- **Philadelphia City Hall**, the nation's largest municipal building and the world's largest and tallest masonry building (2005)
- Samuel S. Baxter, leader in municipal engineering (2006)
- PSFS Building, modern high-rise air conditioning (2006)
- Dr. Leo Steg, PE, innovator in reentry systems and director of GE's Space Sciences Laboratory (2007)
- J. Edgar Thomson, first chief engineer of Pennsylvania Railroad and PRR President (2007)
- Golden Age Engineers Of GE Aerospace and Lockheed Martin, innovators in reentry vehicles, spacecraft and related products beginning in 1956 (2007)
- C.R. "Chuck" Pennoni, PE, an exemplary civil engineer and businessman (2007)
- Frank Piasecki, original pioneer of the United States helicopter industry (2008)
- Ralph Modjeski, pioneer of American Bridge engineering (2009)
- Constantine Papadakis, PhD, PE, innovator in higher education (2010)
- Hilliard W. Paige, pioneer of aerospace development (2010)
- Joseph Bordogna, Ph.D., international authority on science and engineering education and research (2011)
- Roy F. Weston, Ph.D., P.E., DEE renowned environmental engineer (2011)
- Carl A. Baumert, Jr., PE, renowned structural engineer (2012)
